The current total membership is 923, including 12 complimentary memberships*. Permanent membership is up 3 from the last report at 911, and there were 6 new complimentary members.

Personal Membership (ie full members excluding corporate schemes) stands at 83 and there are 828 corporate members. The list of joiners and leavers since the last report is attached.

At the same time last year, we had a total of 101 personal members, (55 entitled and 46 non-entitled).
